Once API integration has started, what are the first steps to begin uploading documents?	 The first step to begin uploading is to create your <u>API key and secret</u> on our web-app. Before you can upload documents to Ocrolus, you have to <u>create a new book</u> to organize them. In order for Ocrolus to process your documents, the next step would be to <u>Upload the PDF to a book</u>. If you are uploading images, you can <u>upload a group of image files</u> to a book and confirm that all image files have been uploaded to an image group. 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What is a form type?	The optional <u>form_type</u> parameter specifies the document type of the images uploaded. How do I extract the results/lender analytics?	We provide data for a book in 2 forms, a <u>Transaction List</u> and <u>Analytics</u> . You can retrieve the Ocrolus analytics for a book in JSON or Excel format. The <u>extra_fields</u> parameter to the Analytics (JSON) Endpoint allows a convenient mechanism to request additional optional analytics provided by Ocrolus. Can I be notified when my results are ready?	Webhooks are a more dynamic mechanism to be notified about completion events, as opposed to polling specific status query endpoints. You can configure the endpoint associated with your API account by using the <u>Configure Webhook Endpoint</u> . Can I control which accounts in my organization have access to a particular book?	A <u>public book</u> is accessible by all accounts in your organization, while a private book is only accessible by its owner and any accounts that have been explicitly granted access. <u>Update</u> <u>Book Authorization Endpoint</u> allows you to change the public/private status of an existing Book, providing a coarse- grained access-control mechanism.	https://docs.ocrolus.com/reference/update- book-authorization
